



## **About KanDrive**

KDOT launched **KanDrive** in 2009 to increase awareness among travelers, commuters and truck drivers about KDOT's Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) and Advanced Traveler Information System (ATIS) services. KanDrive helps travelers make informed decisions before they travel and along the way so they can plan an efficient trip.

**KanDrive** uses ITS, ATIS and other sources to connect travelers to news about weather-related driving conditions, work zones, traffic incidents and weather forecasts for Kansas highways through a variety of communication mediums. It also links travelers with other helpful travel information, including traffic conditions for certain highways in the Kansas City area, data from roadway weather stations, services for over-the-road truckers and tourist information.

KanDrive, **[www.KanDrive.org](http://www.KanDrive.org)**, is an online information gateway to services such as:

- **An interactive, online color-coded 511 map** (<http://511.ksdot.org>) that displays closed roads, weather-related road conditions, work zones and traffic incidents.
- **Camera snapshots** of the roadway that update every few minutes from closed-circuit cameras installed along I-70 and other highways in other parts of the state.
- **Messages** from roadside message signs that advise travelers about traffic conditions including road closures, accidents, work zones and other emergency information that may affect their trips.
- **Links** to travel maps of the state, counties and cities; links to neighboring states' travel information; traffic conditions in Kansas City through KC Scout; work zone information in the Greater Kansas City area (Kansas side); and information about the Kansas Turnpike (KTA).

**KanDrive** helps travelers plan their trips when they visit the KanDrive website or when they call "**511**" on any phone (wireline and wireless) from anywhere in Kansas to learn about weather-related road conditions and work zones and travel weather information for any interstate, U.S., or state highway in Kansas, the Kansas turnpike, and Nebraska. Travelers also can call Kansas 511 from anywhere in the U.S. or Puerto Rico at 1-866-511-KDOT (5368).

**KanDrive** also helps travelers plan their trips when they use their **mobile devices** (smart phones, or other mobile Internet access devices) to visit <http://511mm.ksdot.org> to get a list of closed roads and driving conditions on the state highway system (including interstate, U.S. and state highways and the Kansas turnpike) as well as map, camera and message sign views and links to weather.

### **How can media outlets show video from KanDrive?**

KDOT has partnered with Trafficland to make video from our cameras available to media outlets. Trafficland will sell subscriptions to media outlets that wish to broadcast the video on their daily newscast. They will distribute KDOT video at a lower cost than individual TV stations could if they purchased equipment and paid telecommunication costs. Annual cost will vary, depending on the amount of video feeds and JPEG images requested. The video will show the KanDrive logo. While Media will subscribe with Trafficland, they should note that the video is provided by the KDOT KanDrive program.
